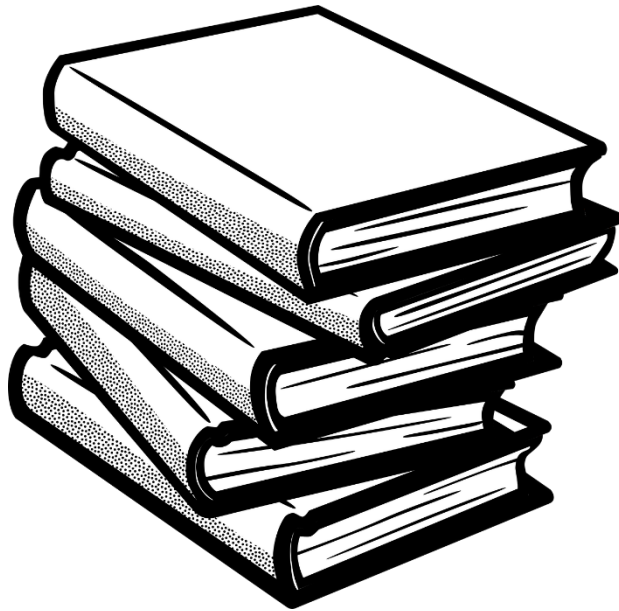

# Pathfinders

Pathfinders is a special program designed for children ages 4-6 which covers Pre-K, Kindergarten, and Grade 1 academic content and skills. Differentiation is integrated into the program to provide different levels of learning for various students, but they accomplish tasks and learn content more as a group with a greater level of guidance and direction. Pathfinders learn foundational math and literacy skills as well as basic concepts of social studies, science, computers, health, art, and Spanish.

## Language Foundations Courses

These courses lay a vital foundation that produces confident readers and writers who know how the English language works and how to use it to express ideas to others. Encounter Academy's Language Foundations Courses follow the Abeka Language Series as the primary worktext, while adding in daily interactive, hands on, and social learning activities to give a well-rounded learning experience.

The courses are laid out on three different tracks (light, moderate, and strenuous). Students can move between tracks as is needed and appropriate. Families have the freedom to choose the course which is the best fit for the student knowing that he or she will be eligible to attend the same Math & Literacy Class and will complete the same group activities as that of his or her peers. Worktext assignments are completed independently with the support of teachers during Individualized Education Blocks (IEB) at the Encounter Learning Center or with the support of parents/guardians from home. Class activities are completed during the Math & Literacy Class of the student's age group or at home with family members. This method allows for differentiated instruction, which means enabling students to work at the most appropriate level through the worktext while also benefitting from learning and reviewing age level information and skills with others.

English Foundation Courses are open to Scouts (Lower Elementary - ages 6-9) and Explorers (Upper Elementary - ages 9-12). Students seeking an alternative high school diploma may enroll in a modified Language Foundations course which excludes the class activities component to earn half (.5) of an English High School credit when all four parts of the course are completed (1 year). One-quarter credit can be earned by completing two parts.

**Required Materials:** *If completing this course as a homeschool student rather than an enrolled student, the corresponding teacher editions and answer keys will be needed. **Be sure to order student worktexts in the bound format.***

# Math Mastery Courses

Math Mastery Courses build within students a solid understanding of mathematics preparing students to apply this understanding to everyday tasks and challenges in our world.

Encounter Academy's Math Mastery Courses follow the Math U See Series as the primary worktext, while adding in daily interactive, hands on, and social learning activities to give a well-rounded learning experience. If Math-U-See books are ordered over the phone and with a missionary account, their materials can purchased at a 50% discount.

Courses are offered in three different intensity levels (light, moderate, and strenuous).

- **Light Courses** – Students complete parts A, B, and D of each lesson completing only the odd #'s as well as the odd questions on the end of lesson test each week.
- **Moderate Courses** - Students complete parts A, B, and D of each lesson as well as the end of lesson test each week.
- **Strenuous Courses** - Students complete parts A, B, C, D, E, F and G of each lesson as well as the end of lesson test each week.

Families have the freedom to choose the course which is the best fit for the student knowing that he or she will be eligible to attend the same Math & Literacy Class and complete the same group activities as that of his or her peers. Worktext assignments are completed independently with the support of teachers during Individualized Education Time (IEB) at the Encounter Learning Center or with the support of parents/guardians from home. Class activities are completed during the Math & Literacy Class of the student's age group or at home with family members. This method allows for differentiated instruction, which means enabling students to work at the most appropriate level worktext while also benefitting from learning and reviewing age level information and skills with others.

Math Mastery Courses are open to (Lower Elementary - ages 6-9) and Explorers (Upper Elementary - ages 9-12). Students pursuing an alternative high school diploma may enroll in a modified Math Mastery course which excludes the class activities component to earn half (.5) of a Math High School credit when all four parts of the course are completed (1 year). One-quarter credit can be earned by completing two parts. This applies to Math Mastery 1-7. Math Mastery 8 (Algebra I) is a standard high school credit bearing course.

# Unit Studies

Unit Studies courses alternate between STEM and Social Studies topics and include literature, informational text, spelling, vocabulary, writing, speaking, listening, digital literacy, and biblical worldview.

The topics are arranged to follow the chronological story of history as much as possible. STEM topics typically have significant connections to the preceding or following social studies topic. Topics are rotated through in a three-year cycle, meaning students will revisit topics later in their academic years reexamining the subject with a greater degree of understanding and maturity than in the early years. The goal is to give students a good picture of the story of the world and show how God has been at work throughout the nations over the centuries. We also want the students to not only learn scientific facts but understand how the laws of nature were discovered and applied throughout history as man faced new challenges.

All students study the same topics at the same time, but complete assignments according to reading level and course intensity level (light and moderate). The various reading levels include: Jade (Grade 1-2), Amethyst (Grade 3-4), Sapphire (Grade 5-6), Emerald (Grade 7-8). Parents/ guardians can help determine their student's reading level with the San Diego Quick Assessment located in the appendix or at this website [https://www.cibhs.org/sites/main/files/file-attachments/san\\_diego\\_quick\\_assessment.pdf](https://www.cibhs.org/sites/main/files/file-attachments/san_diego_quick_assessment.pdf). Students should be placed somewhere between their independent and instructional reading levels regardless of age.

No matter the course variation, all students complete the same in class activities as their peers during STEM/Social Studies Class. Students will also be working through Unit Studies material during Math & Literacy Class. Unit Studies Courses are open to Scouts (Lower Elementary - Ages 6-9), Explorers (Upper Elementary - Ages 9-12).

## **Jade Amethyst Bridge**

Students who have completed all reading levels and are ready to begin more advanced work will transition into the Amethyst program in the following steps typically spending one quarter at each step to learn new tasks and adjust to an increased workload.

**Step 1:** Amethyst spelling & vocabulary words + Amethyst reading assignments – all other assignments at Jade level.

**Step 2:** Amethyst spelling & vocabulary words + Amethyst reading + Amethyst identify/ timeline activity + Webquest

**Step 3:** Amethyst spelling & vocabulary words + Amethyst reading + Amethyst identify/ timeline activity + Webquest + Biblical Worldview + Amethyst Writing (no project)

**Step 4:** All Amethyst assignments including project

# Spanish Language Arts

Spanish Language Arts is designed to strengthen each student's ability to read, write, and communicate in Spanish. Daily homework assignments are given, and Tuesday afternoons are set aside to give students opportunities to read, write, play games, and complete other activities in the Spanish language.

Beginner Spanish is most appropriate for students who only have very limited Spanish proficiency. Intermediate Spanish is for students who can orally communicate in Spanish but need further instruction and practice in writing and reading in Spanish. Both Beginner and Intermediate Spanish courses come in Light and Moderate versions of the course. Light courses will require less independent work for the student to complete than the moderate version of the course.

# Adventure Courses

The Adventurer program is a three-year Jr. High School Program for students to begin at ages 12 or 13 and covers grades 7-9 while allowing students to start earning high school credits. The program is designed to prepare student for transitioning to the Associates Program in their 10<sup>th</sup> Grade Year which leads to a US accredited High School Diploma and Associates Degree from Liberty University.
